2009 Kawasaki Ninja ZX-6R Wins Roadracing World 2009 600cc Sportbike Shootout (USA)

All-new for 2009, the Kawasaki Ninja ZX-6R soundly trounced a competitive field in the 2009 Roadracing World 600cc Sportbike Shootout.

The superior performance from its new stronger engine, better handling chassis, innovative suspension and strong brakes earned the 2009 ZX-6R a clear-cut win. A wide variety of high marks on the race track and street clearly defined it as the victor.
